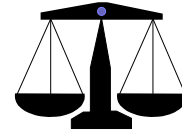

### Jury Proceedings Guidelines for the Dissemination of Information

#### Initiation of Proceedings

1. Upon receipt of any protest, request for redress or Application from a Competitor, the Jury will, as soon as practicable, provide ACM Media Relations and each Competitor with a summary of the matter. This summary may be reported to journalists by ACM Media Relations and by the Competitors at their discretion.

#### Oral Hearings

2. Media observers authorised by the Jury may attend oral hearings. Currently Marcus Hutchinson and Peter Rusch are authorised. Unless otherwise directed by the Jury, authorised media observers shall not make public the Applications, Responses, Replies, Protests, Requests for Redress, or any of the evidence, documentary or otherwise prior to the publication of the Jury's decision.

#### Other Hearings

3. Throughout a proceeding, the Jury may, from time to time and after consultation with the principal parties involved, provide summaries of the status of the matter to ACM Media Relations and the Competitors. These summaries may be reported to journalists by ACM Media Relations and by the Competitors at their discretion.
4. Except for the summaries provided above, ACM Media Relations, Competitors and the Jury shall not otherwise provide to the media any information or comment regarding matters pending before the Jury.
5. ACM Media Relations shall not have access to the Americas Cup Jury Electronic Case Facility (ACJ ECAF).

#### Decisions

6. As soon as practicable after making its decision, the Jury will inform ACM Media Relations and the Competitors, which may then report such decision to journalists.
